INTRODUCTIONS - Terri Besworth & Amy Banmen

- Introduction to the new Executive. Confirmation that Milk/Fruit and Vegetable role will be fulfilled by Suzannah Haley and Gerry Besworth
- Objectives of the PAC were outlined: fundraising and building community

PRINCIPAL UPDATE - Jill Reid

- Classrooms are starting to look more normal. Still using the barriers and keeping the
 classroom environment as closed and safe as possible. If the teachers can have their
 space protected they can be more free in the room.
- Kids are excited to go to the library and music room again.
- 204 students now registered 10 students over what we are staffed for. We have applied for more staffing to get a permanent teacher for Division 5 on Friday's.
- School Action Plan for Learning:
 - Key goal is for kids to know what they're doing and why they're doing it. We will see what they are doing in PAC meetings.
 - First Nations principles for learning will be embedded in everything they do.
 - Mental health and wellness continued focus on self regulation and executive function, specifically on resilience. A teacher will attend one of the PAC meetings to explain more.
- Recognition Assemblies will commence in September/ sept/oct
- Field Trips: District has asked to hold off any plans for Field Trips until we know how
 the school year works out COVID wise. There are already guidelines and rules in
 place for the transportation of kids and any times where the kids are gathered
 together that will guide us as and when trip are considered.
- Jill encouraged parents with questions to reach out by phone to her at any time.

TREASURER REPORT - Zoe Sanborn

- Last year profit \$21,060.68
- Still have the orange shirt invoice to come out of that number.

- Good position as we didn't spend much money and had a high fundraising year in 2019/2020.
- Gaming Grant has been applied for, will find out if we will receive it by September 30.
- Direct donations will be available soon on cash online we use Cash Online for direct donations as everyone is not registered for the parent council site. Direct donations are for those that don't want to participate throughout the year.
- Our GIC matured this year, resulting in a \$250 profit item. We will probably not do a GIC this year as we don't have as much money.
